ADULT FICTION

Heartwood by Amity Gaige

In the heart of the Maine woods, an experienced Appalachian Trail hiker goes missing. She is forty-two-yearold Valerie Gillis, who has vanished 200 miles from her final destination. Alone in the wilderness, Valerie pours her thoughts into fractured, poetic letters to her mother as she battles the elements and struggles to keep hoping. At the heart of the investigation is Beverly, the determined Maine State Game Warden tasked with finding Valerie, who leads



the search on the ground. Meanwhile, Lena, a seventy-sixbirdwatcher in a Connecticut retirement community, becomes an unexpected armchair detective. Roving between these compelling narratives, a puzzle emerges, intensifying the frantic search, as Valerie's disappearance may not be accidental.

YOUNG ADULT FICTION

Sunrise on the Reaping by Suzanne Collins As the day dawns on the fiftieth annual Hunger Games, fear grips the districts of Panem. This year, in honor of the Quarter Quell, twice as many tributes will be taken from their homes. Back in District 12, Haymitch Abernathy is trying not to think too hard about his chances. All he cares about is making it through the day and being with the girl he loves. When Haymitch's name is called, he can feel all his dreams break. He's torn



from his family and his love, shuttled to the Capitol with the three other District 12 tributes: a young friend who's nearly a sister to him, a compulsive oddsmaker, and the most stuck-up girl in town. As the Games begin, Haymitch understands he's been set up to fail. But there's something in him that wants to fight ... and have that fight reverberate far beyond the deadly arena.

JUVENILE FICTION

Rebellion 1776 by Laurie Halse Anderson

In the spring of 1776, thirteen-year-old Elsbeth Culpepper wakes to the sound of cannons. It's the Siege of Boston, the Patriots' massive drive to push the Loyalists out that turns the city into a chaotic war zone. Elsbeth's father her only living relative -- has gone missing, leaving her alone and adrift in a broken town while desperately seeking employment to avoid the orphanage. Just when things couldn't feel worse, the smallpox epidemic sweeps across Boston. Now, Bostonians must fight for their lives against an invisible enemy in addition to the visible one.

While a treatment is being frantically fine-tuned, thousands of people rush in from the countryside begging for inoculation. At the same time, others refuse protection, for the treatment is crude at best and at times more dangerous than the disease itself. Elsbeth, who had smallpox as a small child and is now immune, finds work taking care of a large, wealthy family with discord of their own as they await a turn at inoculation, but as the epidemic and the revolution rage on, will she find her father?

Telescopes

Exploring the night sky is a magical experience, and your library makes it easy and free with our telescopes available for checkout! Whether you're a beginner or a seasoned stargazer, our telescopes are user-friendly and come with instructions to help you get started. Observing the stars, planets, and moon from your own backyard is a great way to connect with nature, spark curiosity, and learn something new. It's also a perfect family activity—kids and adults alike will be amazed at what they can see when they look up.



June is a fantastic month for stargazing! This month, keep an eye out for the bright planet Saturn, which rises in the early morning hours, and Jupiter, which becomes visible just before dawn. The Summer Triangle—a group of three bright stars (Vega, Deneb, and Altair)—will be climbing higher into the sky each night. June 20 marks the Summer Solstice, the longest day of the year, and while that means shorter nights, it also brings warmer weather for comfortable evening skywatching. Around the full moon on June 21, you'll have a great opportunity to observe the moon's craters and surface details. Stop by the library, check out a telescope, and discover the universe from right where you are!
